### **About SA2020**

Every ten years, a growing number of San Antonians co-create a shared vision, made up of specific results and indicators by which to measure progress. Most recently, in 2020, nearly 12,300 San Antonians reaffirmed and strengthened nine Community Results for the year 2030 and identified more than 50 Community Indicators. SA2020, an independent, nonprofit organization, drives progress toward San Antonio's shared Community Vision through research, storytelling, and practice. ### **About City Council**

San Antonio's City Council is made up of ten city council members, who are elected to serve a single district, and the Mayor, who is elected at-large. They serve as the policy-making and legislative body within the City's government, while the City Manager manages the day-to-day operations of the City.

Each of the ten City Council representatives and Mayor can serve up to four, two-year terms. The next Municipal Election is May 6, 2023 with early voting from April 24 - May 2. 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### Introduction


San Antonio's shared Community Vision is a clear picture of the community's priorities—affordable housing, accessible public transit, a world-renowned creative community, high quality education from pre-k to post-secondary, comprehensive support for physical and mental health, an economy that ensures the well-being of all, climate action, and more.

Achieving the shared vision requires targeted, race-conscious interventions to end systemic inequities. We know this because the first decade of driving progress toward the shared vision proved it.

SA2020's City Council Profiles disaggregate community data by geography and offer critical insight that can inform policies towards the needs of San Antonians and mitigate the longstanding inequities exacerbated by the COVID-19 crisis.

Making sense of San Antonio's progress and inequities requires first learning about the history of redlining.

From 1935-1936, the federal government surveyed San Antonio's neighborhoods and assigned grades "A," "B,""C," and "D" to indicate the security or risk of investing. Grades, shaded on a map in green, blue, yellow, and red indicated "best," "still desirable," "definitely declining," and "hazardous." The red-lining maps explicitly considered and detailed the population of neighborhoods by race.



For decades, this information was used by banks and mortgage lenders to subsidize home ownership for white people and discriminate against people of color. Redlining was outlawed in 1968 through the Fair Housing Act, but its legacy remains oppressive.

The City Council Profiles show that San Antonio's inequities—in health insurance, digital access, education attainment, poverty, and more—hurt people in historically redlined neighborhoods the most. This is not by chance. Neighborhoods historically redlined make up a part of present-day City Council Districts 1-6. City Council District 2 and 5 encompass the majority of neighborhoods that were designated as Grade D "hazardous" for investment.

Without this historical context, disaggregated data risks supporting harmful narratives that blame individuals for long-standing inequities. The truth reveals the power and responsibility of institutions.

This report includes data for Bexar County, San Antonio, and all ten San Antonio City Council Districts. In 2022, following the 2020 Census, San Antonio City Council approved new district boundaries that will go into effect after the May 2023 election. The data included here, excluding voter turnout and registration data, uses these new district boundaries.

The Appendix compiles all of the data in this report—including margins of error—and lists the data sources. It also offers additional context and resources for continued learning about redlining. Interactive dashboards and a download of additional raw data can be found online.

Data is only as helpful as the critical questions we ask of it. We urge elected officials—current and prospective—to use these profiles and <u>SA2020's Community Data</u> to help ensure policies and budgets meet the needs of San Antonians. We hope San Antonians explore these profiles with great curiosity, use them to hold elected officials accountable to shared goals, and deepen your commitment to San Antonio's future.































### Ⅲ Data ℰ Methodology

#### **Census Tract Approximation**

In May 2022, the City of San Antonio Department of Information Technology Services, GIS Unit provided the overlays of precinct IDs and census tracts for the ten City Council Districts and those outside the City of San Antonio boundaries. The tracts and precincts note intersecting acreage across Council Districts, precincts, and census tracts by percentage.

For voter data, SA2020 used the precinct overlays and percentages aligned to Council Districts in 2021 and 2022. Bexar County Elections Data by precinct was then calculated for the November 2022 Midterm Election and the May 2021 Municipal Election. For all census data, SA2020 used the census tract overlays and percentages that align to the approved new district boundaries that go into effect after the May 2023 election. Bexar County Census Tracts from the US Census Data, American Community Survey 5-Year estimates from 2021 was then calculated for all other data on this page. SA2020 used these percentages to disaggregate indicators by Council District. This assumes population is evenly distributed across acreage. In instances where percentages do not add up to 100%, it is likely due to rounding.

The 5-year estimates from the ACS are estimates that represent data collected over a 60-month period. Because the ACS is based on a sample, ACS estimates have a degree of uncertainty associated with them, called sampling (or margin of) error. The primary advantage of using multiyear estimates is the increased statistical reliability of the data for less populated areas and small population subgroups. SA2020 uses 5-year estimates because we are examining census tracts aligned to Council Districts.

#### Margin of Error (MOE)

When we can't measure all of something, like people in a city, we sample them—measure only some to get an idea (estimate) of what's true for everyone. Sampling introduces error and uncertainty, and the margin of error—for example, "plus or minus three percentage points"— is a measure of how much uncertainty there is. The smaller the sample in relation to the total population, generally, the larger the margin of error. (Source: Alamo Regional Data Alliance)

### **2** Population

These are approximations of population and are used, among other things, to help understand elected representation. The population estimates are calculated using 2021 Census Data with the 2023 redrawn Council District boundaries provided by the City of San Antonio.

Population density shows the concentration of San Antonians within a specific Council District. The demographic breakdown of City Council Districts by race includes the following categories: Hispanic or Latino, White, African American or Black, Asian, Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander, American Indian/Alaska Native, Other Race, and people who are multi-racial ("2+ races"). In some instances, the sample size was too small and has been suppressed. For the population with a disability, this data refers to people with vision, hearing, cognitive, and ambulation disabilities as defined by the Census.

### **⇔**Education & Workforce **♀**

A December 2021 report from the Urban Education Institute at UTSA showed higher levels of educational attainment were associated with greater wages no matter gender, age, or race/ethnicity, although there were still disparities in earnings by race and gender. Educational attainment, then, is linked to increased per capita income and decreased poverty.

Understanding who is working and their needs also helps understand where policies and resources can be targeted, particularly as the City of San Antonio continues its Ready to Work SA program, approved by voters in May 2021. For example, transportation serves as a lifeline to jobs, schools, and essential services like the grocery store. In Council Districts 5, 3, 4, and 2, San Antonians are most dependent on carpool and public transit.

### **命** Households

Households are considered cost-burdened when they spend more than 30% of their income on rent, mortgage, and other housing needs. Approximately one-third of San Antonians are cost-burdened. Overwhelmingly, this falls on renters, as one in two renters are cost-burdened. This disparity can be seen in Council District 8, 1, and 2 respectively. Additionally, Council Districts 1, 3, and 5 have the highest percentages of historic homes, (built prior to 1960). They also have the largest populations of households with one or more people 65 years and over.

Noting where younger and older San Antonians reside, allows resources to be allocated accordingly. District 4 has the highest percentage of households with children under the age of 18 with nearly half of households. This could mean, for example, a need for growth in the number of schools. District 5 has the highest percentage of households with people 65 years or older with just over one-third of households, which could support growth in senior centers.


